

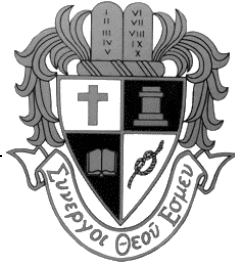

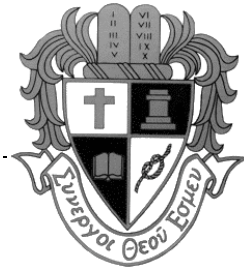

I currently have many projects that I believe can only further the excellence of Sigma Theta Epsilon. These include:

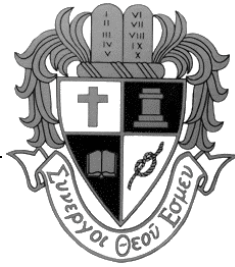
- The National Program Book / Series

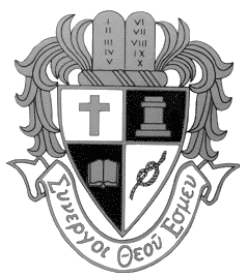
- Compile, edit, and distribute another edition of the Philoi

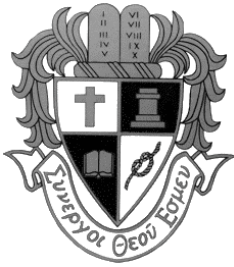

Philoι my brothers,

I'm very excited that the new school year is finally underway. Since school broke in the spring, I have begun my career and moved to Frankfort, the Capital of Kentucky. It's exciting for me because Frankfort is one of the smallest US capitals and I can walk to work and I live down the street from the governor. It's also a short drive to several schools (University of Kentucky, University of Louisville -- both schools of 18,000+ students, and Georgetown College as well as Kentucky State University) and having our new "regional sub-office" for STE in central Kentucky will provide new expansion opportunities down the road. I won't begin proactive campaigns in those schools until at least next spring, but the opportunity is there for the future.

I am currently working on finishing the first ever (to my knowledge) Alumni Chair handbook, which should be available for all chapters by Fall Gathering. I believe that this resource will finally bridge many of the issues I've run into as Alumni Director these past 18 months by helping the local chapters fill their roles, which in turn enables me to do my job.

Now that we have new procedures for reimbursements, I have finally been compensated for the last Alumni Newsletter (October of 2003), and am confident that my personal expenditures for the next newsletter will also be repaid. As such, it's important that all new DKR information be sent to me so that new brothers receive the National Newsletters! For more information on that, see your new handbook.

The latest newsletter is getting a facelift from last years issues, and it is being created with new software as well. It is the hope of the IT Director and myself to use this to transition to e-newsletters (in coordination with the STEdb) which will help lower overhead for the office and enable me to do more with fewer resources.

This fall, each alumni chair can expect to be in contact with me about planning an alumni event for their chapter. This was stated as one of my top goals for the year, and I want to see every chapter (that has alumni) to hold an event before June of 2005.

This fall will also mark my heavy push upon alumni to sign up for the STEdb. We've had a good success rate among actives, but the alumni have not been informed as of yet. I hope to see 20% of our alumni signed up by the year's end.

Finally, I want to announce now that I am looking for an assistant. I'm looking for a long-term commitment - preferably from someone who would like to be a National Officer someday (such as National Alumni Director). I am planning to run for re-election at Conclave 2005, but I'd like some help from whoever might be thinking about holding the office in 2007-2009 to be my assistant now. 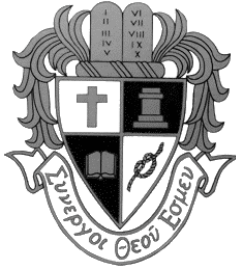

### Housing Corporation

The six months since the 2004 National Conclave of Chapters have been the most productive six months yet in the relatively short history of the Sigma Theta Epsilon Housing Corporation. We have been working with three chapters so far and the following is an update by chapter.

*Epsilon.* The loan to purchase the Epsilon house has been finalized, and as I write this report we currently have the funds in our bank account. All that remains is officially paying off the loan and preparing the deed for the house. New carpet has been installed in the house and we are beginning the process of putting a new roof on the house. The Epsilon House Management Team was formed at the beginning of the summer and consists of the chapter Steward, Toby Locher, as well as alumni Matt Carpenter and Mike Hurtig. They are in charge of the daily operation of the house and have been doing a great job so far.

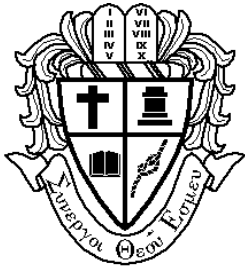
*Beta Beta.* The Housing Corporation has signed a lease on a new house for the 2005-06 school year. The house holds a maximum of sixteen people and is in a prime location, just two blocks away from uptown. To date we have nine guys set to live in the house and expect to add at least three or four more. We are in the process of setting up a House Management Team for Beta Beta and will most likely have it set up sometime next semester.

*Beta Gamma.* The Housing Corporation is in the process of negotiating a new lease for the Rock, and the new lease should be signed by the time you read this. A House Management Team is being set up for Beta Gamma and should be active by the start of the second quarter.

The other major accomplishment of the Housing Corporation over the past six months has been the creation of the Chapter Use Fee. In addition to the rent paid by the brothers residing in the house, the chapter will pay a fee of \$20 per member per year for the chapter's use of the house. This fee will go toward the chapter's share of utilities, maintenance, and so on. The fee may be allocated among the Brotherhood however the chapter desires.

And on a final note, although Conclave 2005 is still almost six months away, it is time to begin preparing for it. My term as a Housing Corporation director expires at Conclave, and as of this moment I do not plan to run again in order to pursue other ways to serve the fraternity. I urge all of the chapters to discuss the Housing Corporation with their alumni to ensure that we have a capable person elected to the Housing Corporation board.

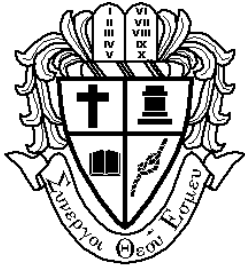
Our next officer elections will be held in May 2005.

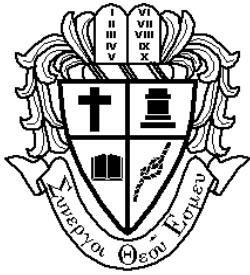
### Epsilon Chapter

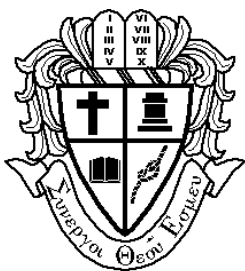

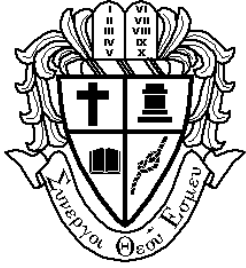
Officer elections will take place in mid-December.

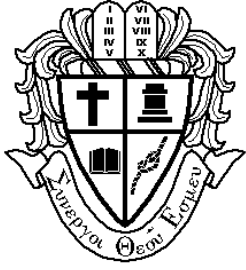

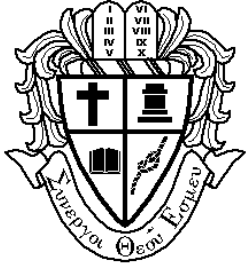

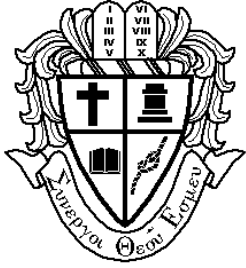
Next Elections held December 2, 2004.

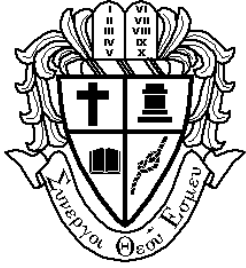
